The Game Plan does not have to be in paragraph form, although some of you may prefer that. You may use bullets or numbered steps...keep it clear and simple to follow, but with adequate forethought. Develop a system that works for you but using this criteria. You may also want to think about how much time you will plan to allow for each step. If so, plug it in where appropriate.

Example:

1. Tell the students that they are expected to clear everything from their desks except their U.S. History books and a pen or pencil. Explain that they are to remain sitting quietly while others are talking. If anyone has a question or something to say they need to raise their hand.
2. Briefly review last week. Ask the students to:
 - Tell the person seated next to them one thing that they remember from...
 - One minute to do this...
 - Each person shares what their partner said.
